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# Dakota Access Pipeline North Dakota Economic & Fiscal Impact Fact Sheet

#### Highlights

During the construction stage of the pipeline project, North Dakota land owners will be receive about \$57 Million in "easement and damages" payments to reimburse them for the restoration and use of their land. Once in operation, the pipeline will annually generate about \$13 Million in local property taxes.

#### Construction stage (2015-2016):

- Pipeline length: 346 miles
- Cost to Dakota Access, LLC for constructing the North Dakota portion: \$1.4 Billion
- Estimated amount of that cost which will be spent in North Dakota: \$655.9 Million
- Estimated impact on production and sales: \$1.05 Billion
- Estimated impact on labor income: \$450 Million
- Estimated number of additional job-years of employment: 7,700
- Estimated increase in state sales, use, gross receipts and lodging taxes: \$32.9 Million
- Estimated increase in local sales, use, gross receipts and lodging taxes: \$1.7 Million
- Estimated increase in state individual income tax: \$5.9 Million

### Operations and maintenance stage (annually beginning in 2017):

- Estimated increase in production and sales: \$8.92 Million
- Estimated increase in labor income: \$4.42 Million
- Estimated number of additional full-time jobs: 66
- Estimated additional state sales, use, gross receipts and lodging taxes: \$113,000
- Estimated additional local sales, use, gross receipts and lodging taxes: \$45,000
- Estimated additional state individual income tax: \$84,000
- Estimated additional local property taxes: about \$13 Million
